ENTRANCE AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM (TEP) – ELEMENTARY

Students will apply for admission into the Teacher Education Program (TEP) as part of the course requirements for EDU 300, INTRODUCTION TO EDUCATION. Transfer students who have had the course equivalent of EDU 300 at another 4-year institution, must make application to the TEP by seeing the licensure secretary in the School of Education during their first semester at Mississippi College. No upper level (300-400) courses including EDU 300 are accepted in transfer from 2-year colleges as part of Teacher Education program requirements. All students applying for entrance into the TEP are given one calendar year form the time of their first testing to pass the Praxis I (if required) and to achieve a cumulative GPA of 2.50 of above. Additionally, the student must:

- 1. have successfully completed 44 semester hours of core.
- 2. have an overall (cumulative) GPA of at least 2.5.
- 3. have a minimum GPA of 2.5 in the area(s) of expected certification.
- 4. pass the PRAXIS I (PPST): Reading 170: Writing 172: Mathematics 169. Entrance tests is waived if student has a high school ACT/21 or higher (no sub-test below 18) or SAT (860 or higher math/verbal).
- 5. have passed the writing proficiency test/or ENG 299.

NOTE: ALL STUDENTS APPLYING FOR ENTRANCE INTO THE TEP ARE GIVEN ONE CALENDAR YEAR FROM THE TIME OF THEIR FIRST ENTRANCE TESTING TO PASS THE PRAXIS I (PPST) AND TO ACHIEVE A CUMULATIVE GPA OF 2.50 OR ABOVE.

ENTRANCE AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROFESSIONAL SEMESTER (PS) AT MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE

STUDENT TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS ARE GENERALLY RESTRICTED TO COPIAH, HINDS, MADISON, RANKIN AND WARREN COUNTIES.

Appeals to student teach outside of these areas must be made to the Teacher Education Department Chair. Student Teaching is to be completed during the senior year after the following requirements have been met:

- 1. be admitted to the Teacher Education Program for at least one full semester prior to the semester of student teaching.
- 2. have completed EDU 299.
- 3. have passed the Writing Proficiency Exam.
- 4. have removed any grades of (1) incompletely.
- 5. have completed any correspondence courses and have grade(s) on file in the Registrar's Office before the Professional Semester begins.
- 6. have at least a 2.5 GPA in the area(s) of expected certification as well as a cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- 7. have completed (with a minimum grade of C) all Professional Education and subject matter courses expect EDU 458 421, 422, and 423 (elementary education \ students only).
- 8. have completed (with a minimum grade of C) all Professional Education and subject matter courses except EDU 458 and 471, 472, 472 (K-12 students who student teach grades K-8).
- 9. upon taking EDU 458 must pass with a grade of C or better.

It is the responsibility of the student to return a completed application for student teaching to the licensure secretary by the assigned date.

Students pass the Praxis I as part of the entrance requirements in the TEP. Students also pass the Praxis II which includes the Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) plus a specialty area test in order to be licensed by the Mississippi Department of Education.

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Completion of an elementary program at Mississippi College and passing the appropriate MDE prescribed tests qualifies the graduate to receive elementary K-4 licensure. In order to add elementary 4-8 licensure, two (2) concentrations must be added. (A 2.5 GPA is required in the areas of concentration.)* Available areas of concentration and additional semester hours needed to add each concentration are as follows:

English: 3 hrs. of electives Science: 8 hrs. of electives Mathematics: 9 hrs. of electives Computers: 15 hrs. of electives Safety/Hlth/PE: 12 hrs. of electives Fine Arts: 9 hrs. of art, music, theater Math/Comp. Science: 12 hrs. of electives (6 computers/6 math)
Science/Computer Sci.: 11hrs. of electives (6 computers/5 science)
Social Studies: 3-6 hrs. of electives (Does not include Psychology)

Special Education: Mild/Moderate: 18 hrs. of electives to include (PSY 435; EDU 488; EDU 458; EDU 445; EDU 455 & EDU 459) Reading: 18 hrs. of electives to include

(EDU 309; EDU 334; EDU 439; EDU 488; EDU 411 & EDU 438)

Foreign Language: 18 hrs. of electives

*Check with the Chair of Teacher Education for allowable courses (remedial courses are not accepted).
