MASTER OF EDUCATION IN DYSLEXIA THERAPY

ADMISSION, MAINTENANCE AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must have an undergraduate degree from an accredited college or university and must be admitted to the Mississippi College Graduate School.
- 2. Must hold an "A" teacher's license or have evidence of experience in teaching or working with children or adolescents. A photocopy of the standard educator license is required.
- 3. Minimum passing scores on the Praxis I tests: Currently: Reading 172 (PPST); Writing 173 (PPST); Mathematics 172 (PPST) (as of September 1, 2012).
- 4. Maintain a 3.0 quality point average.
- 5. No degree requirement may be waived without the approval of the Graduate Dean.
 - --Make application for graduation with the Registrar's Office. (The diploma is ordered from this information.)
 - --Candidates for the Master of Education in Dyslexia Therapy are required to complete 820 clinical hours directly with students as a significant part of the degree program. Verification of completion of the clinical hours and receipt of grades of B or better in all four phases of the activity will serve as the comprehensive exam. Should any candidates receive less than a B in any phase of the clinical activity he/she will be required to have a successful oral examination conducted by program faculty. (4-20-2006)

--Apply for and pass the registration examination with the Academic Language Therapy Association (ALTA) to become a Certified Academic Language Therapist in lieu of the oral-written comprehensive examination with the Graduate Office.
