GENERAL INFORMATION

Accelerated Bachelor of Science Degree (ABSN)

The accelerated nursing (second degree) program at Mississippi College is 4 semesters in length and leads to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing. The curriculum consists of a first degree from an accredited university, 30 hours of nursing pre-requisite courses, and 60 hours of upper division nursing courses. Most students have a significant portion of the prerequisite courses from their first degree program.

The number of students admitted to the nursing major is determined by the administration of the School of Nursing, and may vary depending on the number of qualified applicants and School of Nursing resources.

All nursing pre-requisite courses must be completed before admission to the nursing major. The NUR 250 Transition to Nursing Practice class must be completed within 12 months of commencing clinical courses.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

The requirements for admission to the Mississippi College School of Nursing are:

- Completion of all prerequisite courses with grade of C or higher (30 credits): nutrition (3), developmental psychology (3), anatomy & physiology (8), microbiology (4), chemistry (3), statistics (3), Bible (3), and NUR 250 Transition to Health Care Professions (3).
- Students with repeats in more than two pre-requisite courses (listed above) will not be considered for progression into upper division clinical level nursing.
- A cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher.
- Successful completion of college core courses based on degree from an accredited college or university (must have a first undergraduate degree)
- Completion of the HESI RN Admission Exam with Critical Thinking. If you have a score of 21 or above on the ACT, you are exempt from taking the HESI exam. You must provide documentation of the score.

Accelerated BSN Program

The ABSN program is for students with a first baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university. A direct entry route will allow these students to have their first degree accepted and stand for their core and general education requirements. Specific pre-requisite competencies and the MC Transition to Nursing Practice (NUR 250) course must be met in order to fulfill nursing expectations. ABSN students who do not have a bible course are required to take either Old Testament or New Testament. Completion of the HESI Critical Thinking Exam score and electronic submission of the score is required.

Students interested in pursuing Latin Honors must earn 65 MC credit hours and need to be aware of this when selecting pre-requisite courses, as transfer hours do NOT address this requirement.

Pre-Requisites

Prerequisites are be taken prior to clinical course start. ALL pre-requisites are available in an online format through Mississippi College regular offerings each semester. Anatomy & Physiology 1 and 2, and Microbiology are available as campus offerings each semester.
