## For students who are English majors:

For students who are interested in a degree in English, the department generally recommends following the Core Curriculum courses as indicated in the current undergraduate catalog. We normally suggest that students take an English course, a History course, a Bible course, the correct language course, etc. instead of trying to take all English, or all History, etc.

The following schedule represents what a "TYPICAL" Freshman English major might take:

| ENG | 101 | English Composition | 3 hours |

| MLG | 205 | Cross-cultural Understanding | 3 hours |

*Since all degrees in the English department require a foreign language, we advise beginning the study of your language as early as possible. Students may self-select (with the advice of faculty in the Department of Modern Languages) to enter in at a more advanced level; please consult with your advisor.

Other core courses may be substituted. You may have AP credit, dual enrollment, or transfer hours that would change this "typical" schedule. You may be on a varsity sports team or in the choir and may need to adjust this schedule. The truth is that no one is typical, but this schedule is a good place to start. When you meet with your advisor to register, be sure to tell him/her about your specific set of circumstances so you end up with YOUR schedule and not just a typical schedule.

Chapel: Freshmen are required to take a total of 4 semesters of chapel. Freshmen are automatically enrolled in Freshman Chapel/Blue \& Gold 101 for their first Fall semester.
