

# **Get Ready!**

### 1. Passport

Check your passport. You must have at least 3 months beyond intended departure remaining on an existing passport for travel. If your passport expires before June 16, 2025, renew. (U.S. Department of State: <a href="https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/international-travel/International-Travel-Country-Information-Pages/Portugal.html">https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/international-travel-Country-Information-Pages/Portugal.html</a>)

If you do not yet have a passport, apply NOW. Expect your passport in 6-8 weeks under routine procedure; 2-3 weeks, if expedited (Extra \$60). Here's the process: https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/passports/need-passport/apply-in-person.html

# 2. Meet monthly with the group for academic discussion, guest speakers, presentations

#### 3. Health

- Start walking! You will walk an average of 7 miles per day during the study abroad.
- O Drink plenty of water! You will be at a somewhat higher altitude in Portugal average elevation is 1,221 feet).
- No additional vaccinations needed.
- o Get extra copies of any prescriptions in case you need to fill one in Portugal.

#### 4. Banking

- Let your local bank know when and where you will be traveling so your bank card will work.
- You can exchange \$US through your bank before traveling, access Euro while traveling with your bank card, or exchange in the airport. Note that the airport will charge a fee in addition to the exchange rate, so the most economical approach is use your own bank or exchange at the ATM in Spain.
- How much cash to bring: bring enough for some meals (breakfast buffet is provided each day; most lunches and all but two dinners are on your own (so about 18 meals maximum. The average cost of a lunch in Lisbon is around €8, and dinner is about €12, so if you ate a full lunch and dinner each day €200 would be more than enough)., Also

remember to bring money for airport snacks, coffees, gelatos, and souvenirs. Currently \$1.00 = €.90. Again, check with your bank and your bank card. You may want to have some Euro on hand for small purchases. Major bank cards work in all locations and your bank card exchange rate will be favorable.

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#### 5. Cell Service

 Contact your local provider and discuss the best rates for international service for the time you will be traveling. You will have access to Wifi in most locations.

### 6. Language

- Portuguese is spoken throughout Portugal, but English is spoken/interpreted in all of our site visits.
- o For your convenience, purchase an English-Portuguese dictionary or download an app.

#### 7. Luggage and clothing

- March in Portugal can range from around 67° (F) during the day to 52° (F) at night.
  Cloudy days can be somewhat cooler, but we are traveling during a lower rainfall month.
- Clothing should be business casual (slacks/skirts and polo-type shirts/blouses are fine).
  You'll need a couple of changes of business casual clothing, nightwear, <u>comfortable</u> <u>shoes</u> for walking, sweater, jacket, rain gear (poncho or other hooded rain gear).
- We will check the luggage requirements and costs before travel, but usually one suitcase not to exceed 50 pounds is allowed. Carry-on luggage should not exceed 40 pounds. An extra bag, like a purse or a backpack is also allowed. Allow space for your souvenirs.
